



Joe and Tracy Dutton's agricultural heritage is deeply rooted in Sonoma County. In 1964, five years before Joe was born, his parents Warren and Gail purchased a parcel of property near the little town of Graton just outside of Sebastopol, and name this land Dutton Ranch. Today, Dutton Ranch farms 1200 acres of sustainable vineyards and 200 acres of CCOF apple orchards. Tracy's ancestors began farming apples in the 1920s, and her grandparents Tony and Carmen Kozlowski established Kozlowski Farms in 1949. Starting at a young age, Tracy was working for the family business full time when she met and married the boy from the ranch next door, Joe Dutton.

In 1995, the couple purchased a 20-acre Chardonnay vineyard, which became the foundation of their winery. Tracy and Joe wanted to create a business where their children could work alongside them and continue their agricultural heritage. Today, their daughters Kyndall, Kylie, and Karmen are all involved in the winery, with Kylie serving as the Assistant Winemaker and Production Operation, while Kyndall is supporting Business Development and Winery Administration . Karmen is currently working on a Master of Professional Accountancy at University of Texas, Austin and plans to be a CPA and return to Sonoma County.

Together, Joe and I created a family and a business that our grown children are working with us in today. Our family is a team of forward-thinking farmers that binds succession for the future to sustain Sonoma County agriculture through our vineyards and our wines.
